

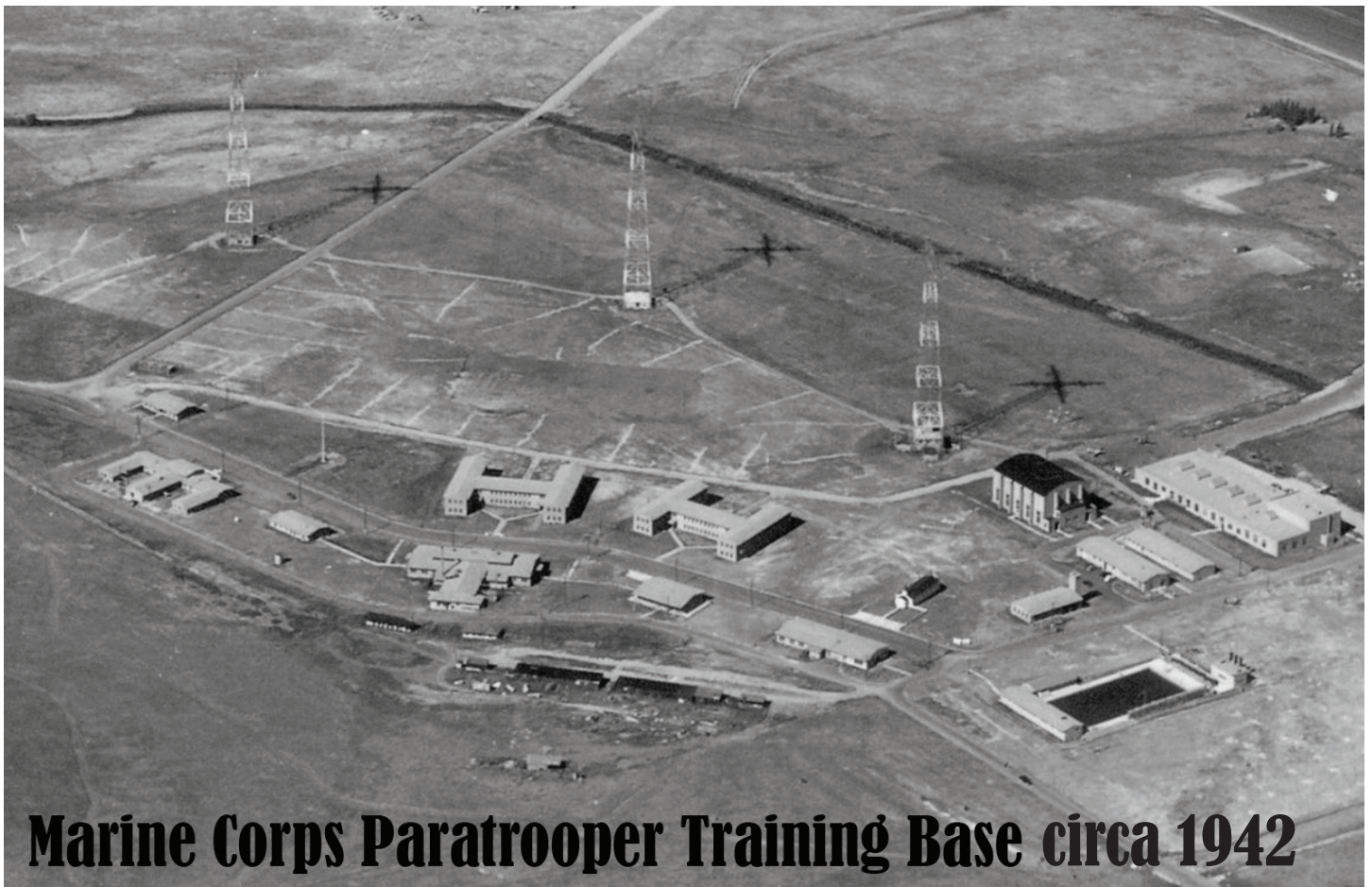
My name is Robert Germann. I am here today for my family. My dad was a Pearl Harbor Survivor. My mom was a Navy nurse in World War II. I am also here for the Marine paratroopers who trained at Gillespie Field Airport (see attachment). Their voices must be heard. In support of Ukraine, our country has banned all flights of Russian aircraft from using U.S. Airspace and landing at U.S. airports, (see attachment). We in East County have Russia's Red Star displayed on airworthy planes parked at Gillespie Field's Airport which are flying over our homes. Russia's Red Star emblem does not distinguish between old and new aircraft and nor should we (see attachment).

We are asking the Board of Supervisors to write and pass an ordinance to parallel the Federal Government's on General Aviation aircraft and General Aviation airports. At this time, no one should be allowed to fly Russia's Red Star on aircraft that fly over our homes, nor land and take off from a Federally funded airport, and that includes General Aviation airports. This ban is not only on Russian aircraft but aircraft registered to wealthy Russians with FAA registration. This San Diego County ordinance should run concurrently with the U.S. Government's ban. I ask the board to promote this ordinance state to state, applying to all General Aviation Airports and aircraft. No Russian Red Star should be flying over the citizens of the USA.
